| III. | Policy: |
| | 1. Each designated trauma center within Imperial County shall submit a trauma registry record |
| | for each patient meeting the following criteria: |
| | A. Patient meets the definition of Critical Trauma Patient as described in Trauma |
| | Triage Criteria Policy. |
| | B. Patients who are triaged as Non-Critical Trauma Patients but are admitted or |
| | transferred to a higher-level trauma center. |
| | C. Trauma deaths that occur at the designated trauma center. |
| | 2. Designated trauma centers shall submit their data to the EMS Agency in an approved format, |
| | on a quarterly basis, or as requested by the Trauma Advisory Committee (TAC). |
| | 3. If a trauma registry record is updated at the trauma center, the revised record shall be |
| | submitted to the EMS Agency. |
| | 4. The Imperial County Trauma Registry will be stored in a secure manner with access restricted |
| | to personnel operating within the trauma quality assurance program. |
| | 5. The Imperial County Trauma Registry will be utilized for quality assurance purposes and shall |
| | be protected from disclosure pursuant to California Evidence Code, Section 1157.7. |
| | 6. Each individual with access to the Imperial County Trauma Registry shall sign a TAC |
| | Confidentiality Agreement. |
| | 7. Aggregate data (without patient or facility identifiers) may be used for reports, public health |
| | surveillance, and injury prevention efforts in accordance with TAC expectations. |
